- Acquiring knowledge about Green Deal, the New European Bauhaus, Next Generation, Horizon Europe and Sustainable Development Goals;
- Increased awareness about the future of Europe, creating a resilient Europe and the role of civic participation defining the future of Europe.

DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITIES

The program actually implemented followed the daily tasks and activities of the Agenda, including also the accommodation, transportation and catering of foreign participants. The meeting was carried out under the management of the host GKRTE in collaboration with some local governments and institutions which are members of the host association GKRTE: LG Mogyoród and LG Domony, Mogyoród Tourism and Settlement Development Ltd. The locations of the additional programs were at local institutions and businesses, and an optional short visit to Budapest also took place.

26/04/2023 (Wednesday)

Arrival of participants and their transfer to the Hotel Libra in City Veresegyház. Participants were welcomed by *János Papp*, Vice President of GKRTE, and *Milán László*, Mayor of LG Town Domony.

27/04/2023 (Thursday)

The basis of the professional work was a lecture accompanied by presentation, the topic of which was: **'Presentation of Green Strategies adopted by EU'**, delivered by *Miklós Marián* external expert. The presentation included the following ppt materials:

- European Green Deal (14 slides)
 - Coronavirus response (8 slides)
 - NextGenerationEU (12 slides)
 - This is NextGenerationEU - HOW TO FINANCE IT (11 slides)
 - New European Bauhaus (10 slides)
 - Recovery and Resilience Facility (12 slides)
 - EU solidarity with Ukraine (4 slides)

In addition, **good examples of green activities** were presented:

- Tree planting program by Company Futureal (3 slides)
- Civil actions: potentials vs reality (pp 20, by *Tímea Varga*)

The program was followed by **sessions of debate**: **"The Future of Europe by its main strategies"** and an **Intergenerational LAB**: **'The future is now? Reflecting about the future of Europe, its main strategies and the role of the civil society'**, in which all participants took place: foreign delegations and the 28 students accompanied with two teachers of the local Gábor Dénes High School and Technical School (Isaszeg). The students were asked to write answers to a series of questions in relation to the main topic of the program. The following 8 questions were set up:

1. What are the most relevant 5 topics of the green future?
2. Which theme do you feel personal interest in?
3. In which topic do you want to do something directly?

4. Which European Programme have you heard about or took part in relation to green purposes?
5. How much do you believe in the success of the EU programs (in percentage)?
6. What do you wait from the programs?
7. What do you see the largest obstacle for achieving the goals?
8. What kind of activity could you exercise for supporting the success of the programs?

The participants gave short and honest answers, which prove that the topic of green programs is not unknown to them and that after obtaining more information, they will tend to cooperate in order to achieve the goals. The answers have been documented by scanning the written text.

The afternoon program included a **visit to the Lázár Equestrian Park** in Domonyvölgy, where the participants saw the property, livestock and museum exhibition of the internationally famous gear-driving competitors, and a tourist presentation program.

The group of foreign visitors took part in a **sightseeing program in the City Gödöllő** and were able to **visit the capital city Budapest** as well.

28/04/2023 (Friday)

The program started with a one-hour session in the Hotel Libra, led by *Miklós Marián* external expert, carrying out a kind of common thinking, titled: **'Creative brainstorming: Participants will define ideas and messages about a resilient Europe and about the Europe that they want.'** Every participant expressed her/his own opinion in the specified question in written form. The answers showed that people were thinking about these issues, they had concrete opinions and made suggestions for reaching the purposes. The answers have been documented by scanning the written text.

The group of foreign visitors were then transported to the City Gödöllő, where the *Dr. György Gémesi*, the Mayor of the LG City Gödöllő welcomed them in the famous building of **Royal Palace of Gödöllő**, followed by Guided tour in the Palace to obtain information about the national history and cultural values of the territory.

The lunch was served in the Klastrom House of Mogyoród, followed by a **'Work session on project management: Tasks of implementation and disseminations. Scheduling the dates for the next meetings'**.

The afternoon program was organized by *Mogyoród Tourism and Settlement Development Ltd.*, led by *Zsolt Zacher*, Managing Director: participants took part in a **guided tour on the Ladislaus Educational Trail**, seeing the efforts of the local volunteers to maintain a specific forest territory in its natural conditions and providing a chance for local people to visit the nature in its natural form. The old part of the city, the **local museum** and a **local vinery** led by an elder local woman was looked it as well. The official program was finished by a social dinner in the **local Babicz Vine Cellar**, where the host winemaker family introduced the participants into the century long history the vine cellar.

29/04/2023

After breakfast the delegations check out from the Hotel Libra, and were transported to the airport or train station in Budapest, organized by the host partner.

RESULTS

- ☐ The participants received information about the European Green Deal program and several related European plans, programs, activities and specific projects.
- ☐ By listening to the thematic knowledge material and discussing it among themselves, the participants formed their ideas and strengthened their conscious attitude towards the EU's green goals.
- ☐ The participants got to know the good practices of the settlements of the hospitality area in relation to environmentally friendly green programs.

CONCLUSIONS

- ❖ The partner delegations expanded their knowledge of the European Union's green goals and the conclusions of the discussed topics contribute constructively to the creation and dissemination of the common products of the project.
